Dear Parents, Welcome to North American Martyrs Pre- Kindergarten Program. We hope this year will be enriching and rewarding for all. Thank you for making us a part of your child's early schooling experience. Let us all pray for a holy, successful school year. Our objectives for preschool are to help children develop:

SCHEDULE/FEES: North American Martyrs offers a full day program for four year olds following the regular school calendar. Children must be four years old before July 31, 2024. The fee is \$4,750/year (practicing Catholic) and \$5,500/year (Non-Catholic) with an additional \$70 incidental fee. At the time of registration, a \$150 nonrefundable registration fee is due. Payment options will be available through the FACTS program.

The school calendar will be available on the website and sent to parents.

ABSENCE: If a student will be absent, parents are asked to call the office (402-476-7373) or email melissa-peters@cdolinc.net and tracy-plautz@cdolinc.net (please cc the teacher). An explanation should be given for the absence as the school is required to submit a weekly report to the County Health Department identifying the types of illnesses that have kept students out of school. We ask that students remain out of school 24 hours after fever or vomiting is gone.

READINESS: Children enrolled in pre-kindergarten should be toilet trained and able to use the bathroom independently (no pull-ups, please). We do understand that bathroom accidents may happen. A change of clothes can be kept in a zip-lock bag in their school bag. The children should be able to put jackets/coats and mittens off and on easily by themselves.

ARRIVAL: Children may come into the building at 7:45 am, when the bell rings. Please do not send your child to school before 7:45 am unless you enrolled them in extended care as the doors are locked and students who arrive early will have to wait outdoors. The school day begins at 8 am.

CLOTHING: Please label with your child's name: coats, hats, sweaters, mittens (no gloves). Students do not wear uniforms; comfortable play clothes are suggested. Clothing should be modest; shirts and blouses with sleeves; stomachs should be covered. For safety reasons, students should not wear sandals, slip on shoes, or flip flops. Tennis shoes are recommended.

COMMUNICATION: Teachers will send out a weekly newsletter to keep you informed on what is going on in the room.

Thursday is our regular communication day at North American Martyrs School. Please be sure we have your current email at all times as most communication and financial statements are sent by email. A report card will be sent home each quarter. Visit with your child after school; share his or her day as soon as possible. Please check bags for notes and papers. Your questions and concerns are welcome any time. You will have a conference in the fall and spring. If a concern arises at school, you will be contacted.

SNACK: Students will have a morning snack every day. The students will take turns bringing snack. A schedule will be sent home each month. When it's your child's turn to bring snack please send a healthy, easy to serve snack. No drinks are needed.

BIRTHDAYS: We will be celebrating birthdays in our classrooms. Your child will be put on the snack calendar to bring snack on their birthday. If your child has a summer birthday we will celebrate on their half birthday.

BATHROOM BREAKS: There is a restroom connected to the full day Pre-Kindergarten classrooms, and students are allowed a restroom break as needed.

LUNCH: Pre-Kindergarten students may eat the school hot lunch or bring a cold lunch. Parents may join students if they notify the office by 9:30 that day. Students eat lunch in the lunch room each day. Parents may monitor their child's lunch account through www.myschoolbucks.com using a student number provided by the office. This student number is for the parents only, students do not need to know it. Money can be deposited to the account electronically; there is a fee for each transaction. Lunch money can also be sent directly to the school office to avoid fees.

REST TIME: There will be a daily designated rest time in each section of full day Pre-Kindergarten classroom.
