


Computer Bits and Bytes:

We live in a world surrounded by technology and we know that whatever field our students choose to go into as adults, their ability to succeed will increasingly hinge on understanding how technology works. But only a tiny fraction of us are learning computer science, and less students are studying it than a decade ago.

If you've heard about the **Hour of Code** before, you might know it made history. More than 100 million students have tried it. The **Hour of Code** is a one-hour introduction to computer science, designed to demystify code and show that anybody can learn the basics. Anybody can host an Hour of Code anytime, but the grassroots campaign goal is for tens of millions of students to try an Hour of Code during December 7-13, in celebration of Computer Science Education Week. Every student should have the opportunity to learn computer science. It helps nurture problem-solving skills, logic and creativity. By starting early, students will have a foundation for success in any 21st-century career path.

Students will have the opportunity to participate in the Hour of Code in computer classes during the month of December. If you and your child would like to try it at home the website is: www.code.org.
