Dear NAM Parishioners,

I really enjoy the pace of summer. It is a chance to read, get outside, vacation and not work too hard. I just looked at the parish sacramental statistical records from the past twelve months (Covid year ending June 30) and we have kept busy. We had 86 Baptisms, 150 First Holy Communions, 161 Confirmations, 31 Weddings, and 10 funerals. The numbers in the 100s were due to Covid postponements and doubling up.

This past month, we had a very nice turnout for Fr. Fleck's farewell and the welcome of Fr. Wahlmeier and Deacon Liam. What a blessing to have so many come and show their love and appreciation for our clergy. It was a fun cookout/potluck. Sorry I did not get more brats from Hy-Vee.

We used every one of the 32 Saltdogs baseball tickets for our Altar Servers appreciation night. It was a lovely Friday night game which featured lots of scoring, fireworks and a torrential downpour. It was fun to get soaked to the bone and splash through the puddles. I think Deacon's car has dried out by now. Another trip to a Saltdogs game for Fathers & Daughters is in the works for Friday, July 30<sup>th</sup>.

The Deacon has been getting lots of experience at NAM. He has done an excellent job preaching daily Masses and teaching his Lex Orandi -Lex Credendi classes on Monday nights. He has Baptized children, attended lots of meetings (Parish Council, Stewardship, Finance Council, St. Vincent de Paul) and sacramental preparations. The program calls upon college students and seminarians to carry out this mission. Those hired are trained and put onto teams to go out into a parish for one week during the summer, putting on a "parish mission" in order to teach the faith and inspire the young.
