Dear North American Martyrs parishioners.

In this mailing is our "State of the Parish" information from the past year during the Covid-19 Pandemic. This is our annual effort to give our faithful some numbers and information about the parish. I will also speak at all the Masses on November 13-14 about our "State of the Parish".

Our Mission is "Witnessing to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and living the Sacramental life." Jesus said, "I have come to set a fire on the earth and how I wish that it was ablaze." Our main purpose is to proclaim the Gospel in season and our of season so people can hear how much God loves them, sending us His only Son, Jesus Christ, who taught, healed, walked, prayed, called, blessed, instituted, sacrificed and ultimately lay down his life out of love for us. We seek to keep proclaiming this Good News and all of Salvation History. We want to foster living out our Baptismal faith as we were immersed into the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ and are made as children of God for the frequent reception of the Sacraments. We offer the Holy Eucharist at least twice a day (four times on Sunday), confessions daily, and all the other Sacraments when the faithful are either prepared or in need of those particular graces.

You can see how many Baptisms and other Sacraments were offered. We had at least 1.000 Masses offered last year (more than normal with a third priest here for much of the year). I am very happy that we had 31 weddings at NAM. These brides made extra sacrifices having their weddings during the pandemic, but never complained; it was all about the sacrament. Last weekend, a visiting priest commented on how nice it was to have lovely Church, a wedding coordinator, an acolyte and servers at the wedding. You would have thought he died and went to heaven. I want to thank our dozen couples who help us with marriage prep by reviewing the FOCCUS instrument with the engaged couples.

We have updated our Active Parish Organizations. Each of these is a big help in uniquely fostering greater faith, community, ministry, education and effective parish life. Every organization is a huge blessing: music ministry. RCIA, Pro-Life, Knights of Columbus, Women of Martyrs.... right on down the line. Two committees meet with me each month and help with the operation of the parish: Parish Council and Stewardship. I can only say THANK YOU to each person in these organizations for your loving commitment to helping our parish be alive and on fire.

In this mailing is our financial report. I want to THANK YOU for the many ways you give of your time, talent and treasure. We have been very blessed financially and are in a good position; I hope this remains. I ASK GOD TO CONTINUE TO BLESS YOU for your good stewardship. We try to be good stewards of each gift to the parish. In the financial summary are ten reasons we had such a good year. Not mentioned are things like the many people who make sacrifices to work here for wages that could be higher elsewhere. For example Sr. Janelle, our devoted principal works for about 1/4 of what she is worth. We have tried to give a decent raise to our faculty and staff this year as we have increased tuition. Our grounds and snow crew save us about \$100,000 by their dedication of time and talents. Volunteers are our greatest asset, and we appreciate every one of you.

Please continue to give back to God as he has given to you. We are blessed by God and Our Lady as we persevere through this Pandemic.


