Example: St. Ignatius of Antioch (35AD – 107AD). He was a Christian martyr who had St. John the Apostle as his teacher ... as in St. John who rested His head on Jesus’s chest and was at the foot of the cross. 6. **The Topic for Tonight: What is the Gospel (Good News) that Jesus Brought?**
  - a) The Good News
    - i) You are known and loved
    - ii) Your life matters
    - iii) What happens after death

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### b) The Kerygma – The history of God moving in humanity.

- i) There is a God.
- ii) He created us in His “Image and Likeness.” Meaning we have free will and we are meant to be known and loved. With these gifts, we’re capable of having relationships with each other and Him.
- iii) At a point in history, humanity choose themselves over a relationship with the One who made them. The Fall.
- iv) We couldn’t fix this relationship, so God said He would do it. Just like fixing any relationship, it requires sacrifice (being repentant and doing something in order to repair the relationship).
- v) God became fully man (while fully remaining God) to help us reconcile and that man’s name was Jesus.
- vi) Christ’s death reconciled us, i.e., the debt of the harm of the first sin was paid.
- vii) Jesus rose from the dead to conquer death and show us that death is only a transition now. The gates of heaven are open to us yet again.

### c) But what does that mean for us?

- i) Jesus founded one Church 2,000 years ago.
- ii) Jesus gave that Church the ability to come into contact with Him not only through prayer but in ways that change a person, i.e., the Sacraments.
- iii) We will talk about how we come into contact with Christ even today.

### d) If this is true and if you believe, that means life looks different for you.

- i) The Mass
