

A NOTE FROM MARK HEFFLEY.

Dear North American Martyrs Family,

This weekend around 100 kids will receive their first Holy Communion! My daughter will be among them. She and her class have been preparing for quite some time. They went to confession, they've been learning about the Eucharist, and they've been praying extra. They are ready and they cannot

It's good to see the excitement of children around the sacraments. Their faith gently invites us to re-examine our own attitudes toward the sacraments. Speaking for myself, I often avoid confession and take the Eucharist for granted, so I'm grateful for my daughter's witness and that of all those preparing for first communion.

All that being said, there's also something beautiful about the ordinariness of the Eucharist. I once heard a non-Catholic say that if he really thought God was there under the appearance of bread then he would crawl on his hands and knees to communion. There's some truth in this. Especially given the widespread disbelief in the Eucharist and (most assuredly) unholy receptions, we need to acknowledge the awesomeness (literally) of the Eucharist. Yet, Jesus disguises himself as bread precisely so that we would receive him. The Israelites were too terrified to go near Mt. Sinai because they saw a glimpse of God's glory. I imagine there would be very few of us brave enough to approach the Eucharist if we saw clearly God's presence. And so God hides in the ordinariness of the host so that we won't stay away, even if God's hiding runs the risk of abuses and neglect, of taking him for granted.

The Church is inviting us to renew our faith in the Eucharist over the next couple years. We can do this by following the example of those receiving their first communion: Go to confession. Get to know Jesus more by reading the Gospels and by praying (especially the rosary). And get to know more about the Eucharist through classes at NAM, programs on FORMED.org, or through the countless resources available. Perhaps the best way to get to know Jesus in the Eucharist, though, is by going to adoration.

Just don't forget the beauty of the ordinary. Lazarus was raised from the dead and that was a big deal. But someday, even resurrections will be common place. And that, my friends, will be just fine.
