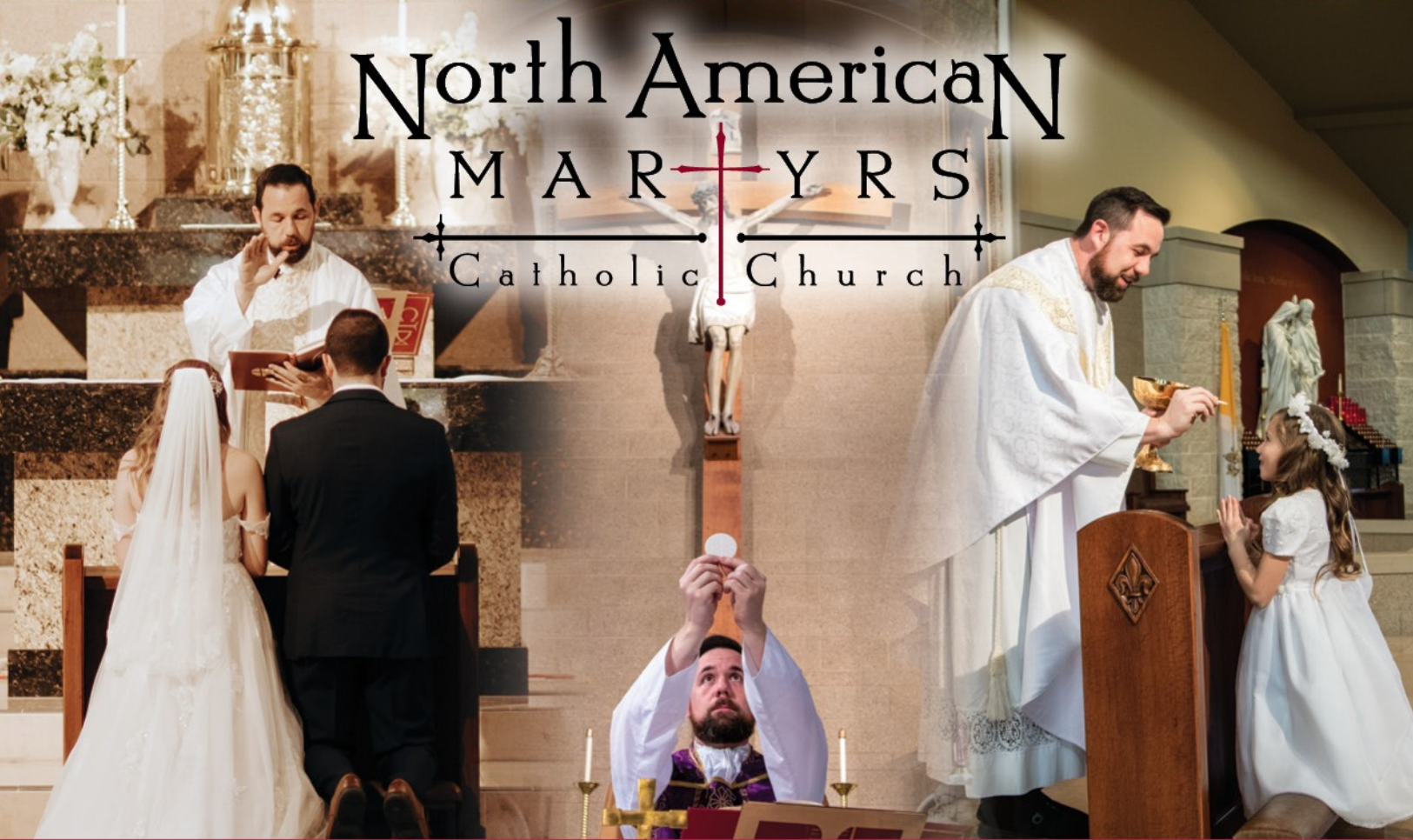

A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR:

Dear North American Martyrs Family,

Holy Week is the week before Easter where we place ourselves in a literal way in the last week of Jesus's life. It begins with Palm Sunday, hearing the Passion of our Lord. I wanted to help explain Holy Thursday and Good Friday:



The meaning of Holy Thursday:

- Jesus washes the feet of His disciples.
- The first ordination of the Church's first priests, who were the apostles. Twelve men who were the closest to Christ.
- The first mass is celebrated. Christ instructs His priests (in the original Greek): "τοῦτο ποιεῖτε εἰς τὴν ἐμὴν ἀνάμνησιν." In English: "Do this in remembrance/memory of me." In other words, celebrate the Eucharist (which IS His body and IS His blood) and consume them worthily.

The meaning of Good Friday:

This evening, we celebrate the first Passion of our Lord on Good Friday. The word "Passion" comes from the Latin *passio*, which means "to suffer" or "to endure." There are three parts:

- The Liturgy of the Word
We have the Passion of the Lord. Try to imagine seeing the events with your own eyes. We have the "Solemn Intercession." During this time, consider how God made the world so that your prayers genuinely help. The priest will gather all your prayers together and offer them to God the Father.
- The Adoration of the Cross
When the crucifix is in place, the priest will remove his vestments (he comes before the cross as one who also needs the sacrifice of Jesus) and venerates the cross. Then people then come to venerate the cross. You may touch, kiss, bow, genuflect, or briefly kneel before the cross.

- Holy Communion
This is the ONE day in the year where there is no mass prayed in the whole world. The Holy Eucharist has been stored from previous masses. There is no final blessing. This is because the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil) are all considered one, three-day-long liturgy. All depart in silence.

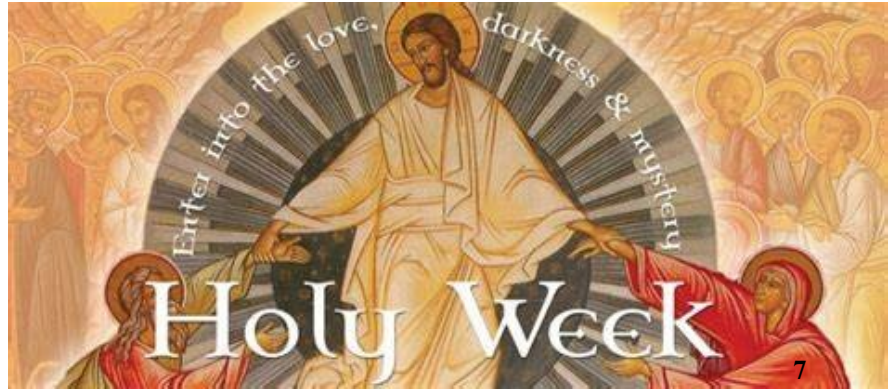
