I hope you have been doing alright in these arctic conditions! I know the disruption of schedules can be very unsettling. I do hope you've gotten some time just


to be with each other and any other positives that can come from inclement weather.

I want to sincerely thank our snow removal crew. Me getting up at 5 something am and seeing them already hard at work was so very impressive and edifying. May the Lord reward their great generosity!

I want to also thank our head of facilities, Caesar Amaya. Caesar put temperature monitoring systems in the areas where the pipes have frozen and burst in the past. We were alerted Saturday that the area by the school library was down to 26° F, which is 6° below freezing! One of our units was just packed with snow (see picture of snow that he removed). While he was working on that, I was busy removing ceiling tiles and calling the teachers to see if they had any portable heating. We needed to get that hallway heat up and that heat up above the suspended ceiling. Thank you to Maria S. one of our Kindergarten Teachers and Heather B. one of our Ist grade teachers!

Long story short, we saved ourselves another burst pipe. I've included a picture from our temperature monitoring app when the temp finally started to climb back up (here was over 28° but then got above freezing). Last year, we got everything insulated against the cold ... but now we have to work on what happens when the wind is intense. I hope you all were safe and sound!



LEARN MORE ABOUT THE PINK SISTERS!




