

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY NEWS North American Martyrs Conference

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul of North American Martyrs, St. John de Brebeuf Conference, would like to take this opportunity to thank our parishioners for their dedicated support to serving those in need by your donations to our conference.

Blessed Frederic Ozanam, the founder of St. Vincent de Paul, is remembered as a beacon of faith, compassion and service to the poor. As a law student at the Sorbonne University of Paris, he was concerned about the social injustices of his time. He realized that it was not enough to simply debate these issues in academic circles. He believed that Christian faith demanded action. In 1833, along with a group of friends, he founded the Society to put his vision into action. They set out to visit the poor in their homes, offering not only material assistance, but also spiritual support and human companionship.

His life challenges each of us today to live a life of service to the poor, following in the footsteps of Christ, who taught us to love our neighbor as ourselves. Today, more than 800,000 members are serving those in need in 152 countries. Our city of Lincoln council is made up of conferences from 10 parishes in Lincoln, plus one in Seward and one in Beatrice.

As members of our conferences, we are regularly asked about what we do, and have we seen an increase in need this past year. This past fiscal year (Oct. 1, 2024-Sept. 30, 2025), our conference at NAM has made 133 home visits, prayed with our neighbors, and offered \$51,819 in financial help. We also have helped with furniture, housewares, personal care items, and food which has been donated.

In comparison, last fiscal year (Oct. 1, 2023-Sept. 30, 2024) we made 136 home visits and offered \$36,269 in financial help. Doing the math, we made 3 less home visits, but helped with \$12,550 more in financial assistance. We have seen the largest increase in rent, which now averages \$1,200 per month.

Our Lincoln Council made 1,214 home visits last year and helped with \$489,415.31. This year they made 1,172 home visits (42 more) and helped with \$565,983 (\$76,567.61 more).

No work of charity is foreign to the society. We have helped with rent/lodging, utilities, automobile maintenance, repair and licensing, insurance, day care, moving expenses, phone/internet, medical, furniture/appliances/housewares, personal care items, bicycle, and food.

We are proud to say that every call is answered by a person—no answering machines, and almost all home visits are done within 48 hours. With other agencies, a message has to be left, and the needy wait a week or longer for a return call. We're also proud to say that 100% of your donations go directly to our neighbors in need. Our members pass around a bag each month at our business meeting for optional donations that cover our expenses such as envelopes, stamps, printed checks, and binders for our treasurer, etc. This money is kept in a separate account for administrative needs. All donations are kept in our "those We Serve Account" and directly help those in need.

We do not use any money from parish accounts. Everything is kept separate. We are a 401 organization, so all donations are tax deductible. We send out statement letters in January to each known donor.

Our St. Gabriel Call Center takes calls from 10am-12pm Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, and from 5:30-7:30pm on Wednesdays. The help line is 402-435-7968, which can be found on the back of our Sunday bulletins. We also take referrals from our priests and school administration.

We have received several generous donations from our parish family and are very thankful. Besides receiving donations from our envelopes in the Sunday collections, online, and in our donation box in the Narthex, we hold two large donation drives each year. These are at Thanksgiving and Ash Wednesday. Specially marked envelopes will be in the pews this Thanksgiving, November 27th, and next Sunday for this collection. We thank you in advance for your prayerful consideration and donations.
